Dear Sirs,

Thank you for this opportunity to comment on the Draft Environmental Impact Statement that was prepared by Group 70 International. As you are well aware Punalu'u is a very special place. The area is rich with cultural history and is an important nesting habitat for both endangered and threatened sea turtles.

My comments and concerns are as follows:

- The conclusions drawn are not supported by the EIS.
- No shoreline certification has been conducted to establish legal boundaries of public ownership.
- An artificial shoreline has been established by planting palms by the previous owners. This is an artificial boundary that continues to interfere with nesting sea turtles.
- Ponds on the property should be public.
- There is currently little or no natural flushing of the ponds by the ocean, which needs to be reestablished.
- Water quality has not been sufficiently addressed; no degradation of water quality, water quality standards must be adhered to.
- The safety of swimmers has not been addressed (there will be the need for more lifeguards if there will be more people in the water).
- Native species of honu, honu ea and seabirds that nest in the area have not been sufficiently addressed (including habitat and food resources).
- Public services have not been adequately addressed.
- The road system will not meet access needs of the public.
- There is no mention of an evacuation plan in the case of a tsunami, hurricane or lava flow.
- Increases in density have not been adequately addressed.
- Traffic at the highway intersection will be negatively impacted, no mitigation methods mentioned. Mahalo,
